The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for RECRD from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that RECRD may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.
